# **QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS**

# The following responses to written questions were tabled by the government:

# Question no. 235 (Ms. Sproule):

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Power Corporation: How many times, and when, has the amine solution, used at the carbon capture and storage (CCS) facility at Boundary dam, been replaced?

# Answer:

There are two different amine solutions used at BD3 – one for CO2 and one for SO2. The first amine extracts nearly 100 per cent of SO2, and then the flue is again chemically treated to extract up to 90 per cent of the CO2. The amine is treated to release the gases, and then it is filtered and cleaned. When the amine solution becomes contaminated or degraded, the CO2 amine is reclaimed and the SO2 amine is replaced. The CO2 amine has never been replaced. The SO2 amine has been replaced seven times including: December 3, 2014; July 12, 2015; November 1, 2015; February 9, 2016; May 14, 2016, June 20, 2016; and November 4, 2016.

# Question no. 236 (Ms. Sproule):

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Power Corporation: What was the total cost of the equipment installed on July 2016 to filter the amine solution at the CCS facility at Boundary dam?

## Answer:

The equipment installed was not purchased but rather contracted as a service to complete the onsite reclamation of the amine.

### Question no. 237 (Ms. Sproule):

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Power Corporation: For each month since July 2016, what was the degradation of the amine solution at the CCS facility at Boundary dam?

# Answer:

For the dates requested, the degradation measured was: July 2016, 7.3%; August 2016, 4.9%; September 2016, 3.0%; October 2016, 2.4%; and November 2016, 2.4%.

### Question no. 238 (Ms. Beck):

To the Minister of Education: For each school division, what is the operating deficit for the 2016-17 school year?

### Answer:

The 2016-17 school division fiscal year does not end until August 31, 2017 and school divisions complete their financial statements at that time.

### Answer:

To the Minister of Social Services: (1) How many vacancies, and for what positions, were there for the child and family services unit at the Prince Albert service centre as of March 2016? (2) July 2016? (3) September 2016? (4) November 2016 (to date)?

#### Answer:

- (1) One assistant supervisor, three child protection workers, two child care workers, and one resource worker
- (2) One supervisor, two assistant supervisors, four child protection workers, one case aide, and one child care worker.
- (3) Two assistant supervisors, four child protection workers, two child care workers, and one permanency planner worker.
- (4) Two supervisors, two assistant supervisors, seven child protection workers, three child care workers, and one resource worker.

# Question no. 243 (Ms. Sproule):

To the Minister Responsible for the Saskatchewan Power Corporation: (1) How much money has the corporation spent on amine in each year since the Boundary dam 3 (BD3) unit was retrofitted with carbon capture and storage technology? (2) How much money has the corporation spent on cleaning amine in each year since the BD3 unit was retrofitted with carbon capture and storage technology?

(1) 2014 – \$982,170

2015 - \$13,447,780

2016 - \$10.259.476

(2) 2014 - \$0

2015 - \$3,104,137

2016 - \$2,846,789

As of December 30, all amine solutions require the removal of contaminants and the parts of the solution that have broken down and become ineffective. The most significant maintenance for the SO2 amine at BD3 is related to fly-ash contamination. Currently, the replacement of the SO2 amine is more cost effective than treatment, and so treatment has been stopped. Replacement of the SO2 amine compares favourably with the cost to purchase limestone, which would be a more traditional SO2 treatment option. The CO2 amine's most significant maintenance requirements are related to degradation. Treating the CO2 amine is more cost effective than replacement, and the CO2 amine has never been replaced. New CO2 amine must be added to make up for the amine lost to degradation.
