# **QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS**

### The following responses to written questions were tabled by the government:

### Question no. 268 (Ms. Sproule):

To the Minister Responsible for the Global Transportation Hub: What is the Global Transportation Hub's current debt-to-equity ratio?

### Answer:

The debt-to-equity ratio as of January 31, 2017 was 1.39.

### Question no. 269 (Ms. Sproule):

To the Minister Responsible for the Global Transportation Hub: (1) How many employees work at the Global Transportation Hub (GTH)? (2) How many employees working at the GTH are working under the temporary foreign worker program?

Answer:

(1) 11

Note: Answer reflects only those working at the GTH head office. The GTH is not responsible for the independent human resource policies of companies that operate at the GTH.

### Question no. 276 (Ms. Beck)

To the Minister of Education: What were the total costs associated with the six-person panel developed to consult on Dan Perrins' K-12 education governance report (including travel, accommodation, per diems, incidentals, etc.)?

### Question no. 278 (Ms. Rancourt)

To the Minister of Government Relations: What data was collected as the result of requests sent to all municipal administrators and city managers for their property tax information with respect to childcare services in their respective municipalities (as referenced in an email dated September 22, 2016, sent to Saskatchewan licensed childcare centres)?

#### Answer:

The survey sent to municipal administrators and city managers on September 20, 2016 asked recipients to provide the following information regarding child care facilities they knew of within their respective jurisdiction: child care centre name, location and address, pays property tax (Yes/No), total 2015 property tax (\$), receives a tax exemption, grant or abatement from municipality, property assessment in 2015 (\$), residential or commercial property class, licensed for business purposes by the municipality (Yes/No).

Survey recipients were also given the option to indicate if the municipality did not have any child care facilities. The municipal response rate was 59 per cent. The survey found 56 per cent of municipalities that responded indicated they provide property tax exemptions to child care facilities.
