QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

The following responses to written questions were tabled by the government:

Question no. 73 (Mr. Forbes):

To the Minister Responsible for Public Service Commission, how many reservists who qualified under *The Saskatchewan Employment Act*, sub division 11, section 2–5, reserve force service leave since 2007 were able to purchase their pension benefits while they were on leave?

Answer:

Since 2007, 10* employees of the Saskatchewan public service have requested and have been granted military reservist leave. All employees on military reservist leave, upon their return from their definite leave of absence, have the option to contribute to their pension plan for the period of their leave. Employees have up to 90 days from their return to work to apply. Of those ten individuals, four opted to contribute to their pension plan for the period of their leave, one declined the option, one individual did not return to the public service so was ineligible, and the decisions of four individuals are unconfirmed at this time.

*It was previously reported on October 27, 2017, that 11 individuals in the Saskatchewan public service had been granted military leave since 2007. A calculation error was made, and the correct number is 10 individuals were granted military leave since 2007.

Answer:

- (a) The Chief Commissioner dismissed 31 cases. The court dismissed one case.
- (b) The Chief Commissioner dismissed 55 cases.
- (c) The reasons for dismissal by the Chief Commissioner are outlined in extensive written reasons provided to the parties and are fact specific. The majority of dismissals fall into two categories:
 - The Chief Commissioner has concluded after reviewing the evidence obtained during the investigation that there is no reasonable prospect that a court would find the complaint to be substantiated on a balance of probabilities, and therefore the complaint is dismissed as being without merit (section 27.1(2)(b)).
 - The substance of the complaint has been appropriately dealt with pursuant to another Act or proceeding (section 27.1(2)(d)).
- (d) The reasons for dismissal by the Chief Commissioner are outlined in extensive written reasons provided to the parties and are fact specific. The majority of dismissals fall into two categories:
 - The Chief Commissioner has concluded after reviewing the evidence obtained during the investigation that there is no reasonable prospect that a court would find the complaint to be substantiated on a balance of probabilities, and therefore the complaint is dismissed as being without merit (section 27.1(2)(b)).
