STATEMENT BY THE SPEAKER (Deferred Ruling)

Earlier today the Opposition House Leader (Ms. Sarauer) raised a question of privilege under the provisions of rule 12 of *The Rules and Procedures of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan*. I received the notice this morning, Tuesday, March 13, 2018 at 10:53 a.m. Upon receipt of this notice, in accordance with the rules, both House Leaders are aware of the details of the case and the proposed question of privilege.

It is the responsibility of the Speaker to determine if a *prima facie* case of privilege has been established. Contempt of the Assembly is a serious charge, which requires careful examination of the case and this Assembly's practices and precedents. The Minister has apologized to the Assembly and I will consider this apology in my decision. However, I have not had sufficient time to carefully consider all matters related to this question, so for this reason I shall defer my ruling.
