We, Her Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the Legislative Assembly of the province of Saskatchewan, in session assembled, humbly thank Your Honour for the gracious speech which Your Honour has been pleased to address to us at the opening of the present session,

and the proposed amendment moved by Ms. Mowat, seconded by Mr. Forbes:

That the motion be amended by adding the following after the words "present session":

And, That this Assembly does not support the agenda outlined in the Speech from the Throne because it lacks vision, fails to take any action to create jobs while people and the economy are hurting, ignores the underfunding of our schools and the growing challenges in our health system, and does nothing to restore trust and bring accountability to their costly mishandling of the GTH and the Regina bypass.

The debate continuing on the motion and the amendment, the Assembly recessed from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m.

The debate being resumed on the motion and the amendment, pursuant to rule 6(7), the Deputy Speaker adjourned the Assembly.

Question no. 3 (Ms. Beck):

To the Minister of Central Services, what were the total costs associated for renovations of the lounge and cafeteria in the Legislative Building in 2016–17, 2017–18, and 2018–19?

Question no. 4 (Ms. Sarauer):

To the Minister of Health, with regard to addiction beds, (a) how many have been created since November 2007, (b) where are they located, (c) what type are they, and (d) which organization operates the facility where they are housed?

To the Minister of Health, which rural hospitals have had no emergency services and had to temporarily close in 2017 and 2018?
