QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

The following responses to written questions were tabled by the government:

Question no. 36 (Ms. Mowat):

To the Minister of Health, in terms of telehealth services through the Saskatchewan Health Authority, (a) what is required for physicians and clinicians to be approved to see patients via telehealth and ensure the services they provide will be paid for, (b) how many sites are approved as telehealth sites, (c) how many physicians saw patients via telehealth in each year since 2013, (d) how many discreet patients have been seen by telehealth in each year since 2013, and (e) how many total visits were provided through telehealth in each year since 2013?

Answer:

Responses to all questions below are based on medical services branch (MSB) physician billing data when physicians have been paid for the telemedicine supplement for direct interactive video link with a patient. It would exclude any services where a physician failed to bill MSB for the service and may exclude physicians who are paid through alternate funding arrangements if they did not shadow bill for the service.

- (a) Physicians and patients must each be located at ministry-approved telehealth facilities in Saskatchewan in order for the physician to be eligible for payment for medically required services. Other clinicians would be compensated for providing telehealth services through their employment contracts.
- (b) There are 179 telehealth facilities that are approved by the medical services branch (MSB) for the purposes of physician billing. Each facility may have more than one telehealth suite available.

2018–19 — 3,060 services (year-to-date)

Question no. 37 (Ms. Mowat):

To the Minister of Health, in terms of opioid assisted therapies, (a) how many doctors and nurse practitioners have provided them in each year since 2013, (b) in which communities are they available, (c) how many discreet patients have received them in each year since 2013, and (d) how much was spent on them in the year since 2013?

Answer:

- (a) Table 1: Number of physicians licensed to prescribe for opioid substitution therapy (OST), 2013 to 2018:

Note: Nurse practitioners are not able to prescribe OST. It is expected that they will be able to prescribe for OST in 2019.

- (b) OST prescribers are located in the following communities: Regina, Saskatoon, Prince Albert, North Battleford, La Ronge, Lloydminster, Moose Jaw, Yorkton, Rosthern, Estevan, Swift Current, Fort Qu'Appelle, Redvers, Marquis, and the rural municipality of Corman Park.
- (c) Table 2: Number of discrete patients receiving OST, by year:

*The increase in buprenorphine/naloxone clients is due to drug plan coverage of buprenorphine/naloxone approved for OST effective January 1, 2017. Prior to this change, it was covered only when methadone was not accessible or deemed not appropriate.

Question no. 38 (Mr. Belanger):

To the Minister of Highways and Infrastructure, in terms of the intersection where Highway 335 and Highway 35, also known as Armley Corner, (a) for each year since 2008, how many complaints were reported from the public, and (b) for each year since 2008, what safety modifications were added or undertaken?

Answer:

- (a) Between the years of 2008 and April 2018 we did not receive any inquiries from the public. Following the accident in April 2018 to present, we have received 78 written inquiries (including emails).
- (b) Between the years of 2008 to April 2018, there were no additional safety modifications added or undertaken at the intersection of Highway 335 and Highway 35. Since April 2018 we have removed brush in the right of way and placed a temporary speed reduction at the intersection.

Question no. 41 (Ms. Sarauer):

To the Minister of Social Services, (a) when was the last time youth homelessness was quantified, and (b) what were the results of this quantification?

Answer:

The Ministry of Social Services has not quantified youth homelessness.

Question no. 42 (Ms. Sarauer):

To the Minister of Social Services, what specific measures has the ministry undertaken to address youth homelessness?

Answer:

The ministry encourages organizations to refer youth at risk of being homeless to their local Social Services office to ensure the youth receives the support or assistance that they need. For children and youth under the age of 16, the ministry is obligated under *The Child and Family Services Act* to ensure their protection and safety; this includes having access to safe and appropriate living arrangements. The ministry provides a range of services to 16- and 17-year-old youth (Section 10), including support in obtaining and maintaining appropriate living arrangements.

Question no. 43 (Ms. Sarauer):

To the Minister of Social Services, in terms of research and/or studies undertaken related to youth homelessness in Saskatchewan, (a) what are the names of these studies, (b) when were they undertaken, (c) what was the criteria used, and (d) what were the findings?

Answer:

No research or studies have been completed regarding youth homelessness by the ministry.

QUESTIONS ORDERED FOR RETURN

The following written questions were converted and order for returns were issued:

Return no. 16 (Ms. Mowat):

To the Minister Responsible for eHealth, in terms of contracts for external consultants, (a) the policy on hiring outside consultants, (b) the number of external consultants that were hired and/or awarded contracts in each year since 2012, (c) the names of consultants or consultant companies in each year since 2012, (d) the expenditure on external consultants in each year since 2012, and (e) the oversight that exists related to the decision to hire an external consultant over internal expertise.

Return no. 17 (Ms. Mowat):

To the Minister Responsible for eHealth, for each contract entered into by eHealth since 2013, (a) the good or service, (b) the value of the contract, (c) who the contract was awarded to, (d) if the contract was tendered, (e) if so, how it was tendered, and (f) the level of management oversight that was involved.

Return no. 18 (Ms. Mowat):

To the Minister Responsible for eHealth, in terms of the citizen health information portal (CHIP), (a) the contractual relationship between Telus Health, eHealth, and Get Real Health, (b) the costs associated with the pilot, (c) the costs that have been incurred since the six-month pilot ended, (d) if any exist, the costs incurred after the pilot ended and what services were they incurred for, (e) the per patient cost for those involved in the CHIP pilot, (f) as part of the contractual relationship, the exact data that has been shared with Telus Health, (g) as part of the contractual relationship, the exact data that has been shared with Get Real Health, (h) as part of this contractual relationship, all the

geographical locations this data is stored, (i) the options that exist for eHealth to terminate the contractual relationship with either Telus or Get Real Health, (j) if the relationship is terminated, the options that exist for all data shared to be fully returned and housed in Saskatchewan, (k) beyond CHIP, what if any uses can the data associated with the pilot be used for and by whom, (l) when phase two of the CHIP pilot is expected to begin, (m) if the phase two contract has been signed, and (n) if so, the cost.

Return no. 19 (Ms. Sarauer):

To the Minister of Corrections and Policing, (a) if there have been any disruptions in phone services at Provincial Correctional Centre since January 1, 2018, (b) for each disruption, when it took place, (c) where it took place, and (d) how long it lasted.

Return no. 20 (Ms. Sarauer):

To the Minister of Corrections and Policing, (a) the design capacity at the White Spruce Correctional Training Centre, (b) the operational capacity at the White Spruce Correctional Training Centre, and (c) the total inmate count that has been at the White Spruce Correctional Training Centre each month since January 2018.
