NOTICE OF WRITTEN QUESTIONS

The following questions were given notice on day no. 41 and are to be answered by day no. 46:

Question no. 73 (Ms. Mowat):

To the Minister of Health, in terms of public health inspections, for each fiscal year since 2006–07, (a) how many plumbing permits were issued, (b) how many plumbing inspections took place, (c) what changes have been made to the Saskatchewan plumbing regulations and what was the rationale for each, (d) how many times were certificates of approval for plumbing issued to the owner or permit holder without having inspections take place, (e) how many health inspections took place (by category), (f) what was the staffing complement for health inspectors, (g) how many facilities were inspected, (h) what was the fee structure for individuals/business owners requiring inspections, (i) how many public education courses have been run, including total number of students, through public health inspectors, and (j) how many education courses have been run through private companies, including total number of students, by public health inspectors?

Question no. 74 (Ms. Mowat):

To the Minister of Health, in terms of public health inspections, (a) for restaurant inspections, what is the process followed when a restaurant fails an inspection or has repeated violations, and (b) have services formerly delivered by public health inspectors been contracted out, if so, when, where, and to whom?
