## QUESTIONS ORDERED FOR RETURN

**The following written questions were converted and orders for return were issued:**

**Return no. 40 (Ms. Mowat):**

To the Minister of Health, in terms of public health inspections, for each fiscal year since 2006–07, (a) the number of plumbing permits that were issued, (b) the number of plumbing inspections that took place, (c) the changes that have been made to the Saskatchewan plumbing regulations and the rationale for each, (d) the number of times certificates of approval for plumbing were issued to the owner or permit holder without having inspections take place, (e) the number of health inspections that took place (by category), (f) the staffing complement for health inspectors, (g) the number of facilities that were inspected, (h) the fee structure for individuals/business owners requiring inspections, (i) the number of public education courses that have been run, including total number of students, through public health inspectors, and (j) the number of education courses that have been run through private companies, including total number of students, by public health inspectors.

**Return no. 41 (Ms. Mowat):**

To the Minister of Health, in terms of public health inspections, (a) for restaurant inspections, the process followed when a restaurant fails an inspection or has repeated violations, and (b) if services formerly delivered by public health inspectors have been contracted out, if so, when, where, and to whom.

**Question no. 76 (Ms. Chartier):**

To the Minister of Health, in terms of the \$11.4M allocated in 2018–19 for new targeted investments in mental health services that was not spent because programs and services were not functioning for the full fiscal year, (a) how much, if any, was carried forward to the current fiscal year, (b) where was this funding allocated, (c) which organizations received year-end funding, (d) how much did each organization receive, and (e) what programs, projects, goods, services, and capital upgrades received previously unplanned funding?
