To the Minister of Health, for each month since January 2018, how many code burgundy statuses/state of overcapacity was there in each tertiary hospital?

Question no. 107 (Ms. Mowat):

To the Minister of Health, what is the patient current occupancy at the Saskatchewan Hospital North Battleford?

Question no. 108 (Ms. Mowat):

To the Minister of Health, (a) how many pediatricians are currently practicing in the Jim Pattison Children's Hospital, and (b) how many have been recruited but have not started?

Question no. 109 (Ms. Sproule):

To the Government, schedule 15-2 (section 200.6.4 Earthworks p. 56 of 124) of the Regina bypass agreement (signed July 2015) says "*Project Co may also obtain for sole incorporation into the Works, earth materials royalty free from the Additional Resources borrow pits identified in Appendix C to Schedule 15-2 – Technical Requirements – Design.*" Appendix C includes sand and gravel pits 62L-373 and 62L-376 at land locations SW-07-17-13-2 and NW-06-17-13-2, (a) what is the total amount of foregone revenues for the materials provided to Project Co "royalty free" pursuant to schedule 15-2 of the Regina bypass agreement, and (b) what is the total volume of earth materials provided "royalty free" pursuant to the Regina bypass agreement?
