### WRITTEN QUESTIONS

The following questions were given notice on day no. 86 and are to be answered by day no. 91:

**1. Question no. 436 (Ms. Sproule):**

To the Government: How much did Loblaws Company Ltd. pay for their land purchased at the Global Transportation Hub?

**2. Question no. 437 (Ms. Rancourt):**

To the Minister of Justice: (1) Did the government engage in an open tendering process before negotiating a new contract for the provision of inmate telephone service with Telmate? (2) If so, how many companies presented a proposal or bid? (3) What analysis was done to determine that negotiating a new contract with Telmate would provide the best value?

**3. Question no. 438 (Mr. McCall):**

To the Minister of Parks, Culture and Sport: (1) Was there a production or productions from Minds Eye Entertainment filmed entirely in British Columbia that received Creative Saskatchewan funding in 2016? (2) If so, what were the amounts provided? (3) If so, what were the sources of the funding provided? (4) Was there an eligible production or productions to be filmed in Saskatchewan that was subsequently denied Creative Saskatchewan support because the available fund was depleted after Creative Saskatchewan provided support to the productions involved in the first question? (5) Will the provincial government and Creative Saskatchewan change the funding guidelines to ensure that films which are to be made in Saskatchewan receive priority over co-productions with other jurisdictions?

**4. Question no. 439 (Ms. Chartier):**

To the Minister of Health: What is the total number of full-time equivalent positions (FTEs) lost as a result of the elimination of the hearing aid plan including audiology positions and support staff?

**5. Question no. 440 (Ms. Chartier):**

To the Minister of Health: What are the values of the individual categories (salaries, pensions, and benefits, etc.) making up the estimated annualized savings of \$2,950,000 from the elimination of the hearing aid plan as cited in Human Services committee on May 1, 2017?

**6. Question no. 441 (Ms. Chartier):**

To the Minister of Health: What was the value of client payments to the hearing aid plan for each year between 2011-2017?
