WRITTEN QUESTIONS

The following questions were given notice on day no. 60 and are to be answered by day no. 65:

1. Question no. 109 (Ms. Chartier):

To the Minister of Health, how many assisted lifts were performed by the Saskatoon fire department in the former Saskatoon Health Region in 2015, 2016, 2017, and 2018?

2. Question no. 110 (Ms. Chartier):

To the Minister of Health, for each community-based organization that received funding from the ministry in the last 5 fiscal years, (a) how much was received, (b) how much was operations funding, (c) how much was capital, (d) how much was provincial funding, and (e) how much was federal funding?

3. Question no. 111 (Ms. Chartier):

To the Minister of Health, according to the most recent data, (a) how many addictions counsellors are there in the provincial opioid agonist therapy (OAT) program, and (b) how many patients across the province are receiving methadone or suboxone for addictions in the OAT program?

4. Question no. 112 (Ms. Chartier):

To the Minister of Health, in terms of the OAT program, (a) what is the number of addictions counsellors working in the OAT program in each of Saskatoon, Regina, Prince Albert, North Battleford, Moose Jaw, Weyburn, and La Ronge, and (b) how many patients are supported in each location?

5. Question no. 113 (Ms. Chartier):

To the Minister of Health, what programs, services and organizations had funding from the ministry reduced in the 2019–20 budget?

6. Question no. 114 (Mr. Pedersen):

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Power Corporation, (a) what is SaskPower's current battery/electrical storage capacity, (b) how much battery/storage capacity is being planned to be added in the next 10 years, (c) what is SaskPower's current electricity generation capacity from natural gas, and (d) what is the anticipated expansion of electricity generation from natural gas in the next 10 years?

7. Question no. 115 (Mr. Pedersen):

To the Minister of Environment, in terms of *The Wildlife Habitat Protection Act* infractions investigated in each of the past five years, (a) how many alleged or suspected infractions were investigated, (b) how many resulted in charges, (c) what category of charges did each fall into, and (d) what was the nature of the alleged offense?

8. Question no. 116 (Mr. Pedersen):

To the Minister of Finance, for each of the last 15 fiscal years, (a) how many individuals reported income which would have been subject to the highest marginal income tax rate (before assessing any applicable credits), and (b) what was the aggregate amount of income tax calculated on those individuals' tax returns (before assessment of any applicable credits)?

9. Question no. 117 (Mr. Pedersen):

To the Minister of Finance, for each of the last 15 fiscal years, (a) how many individuals reported income which would have been subject to the middle marginal income tax rate, but not the highest (before assessing any applicable credits), and (b) what was the aggregate amount of income tax calculated on those individuals' tax returns (before assessment of any applicable credits)?

10. Question no. 118 (Mr. Pedersen):

To the Minister of Finance, for each of the last 15 fiscal years, (a) how many individuals reported income which would have been subject to the lowest marginal income tax rate, but not the middle (before assessing any applicable credits), and (b) what was the aggregate amount of income tax calculated on those individuals' tax returns (before assessment of any applicable credits)?
