To the Government, how many Income Assistance Clients have been identified as having received benefits through the federal Canada Emergency Student Benefit?

3. Question no. 3 (Ms. Conway):

To the Government, how many Income Assistance clients has a benefit reduction related specifically to their receipt of the Canada Emergency Response Benefit?

4. Question no. 4 (Ms. Conway):
