ANNOUNCEMENT: RE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Premier Lloyd: — Mr. Speaker, before the orders of the day, all the members will be aware that we have indicated that we would have a reception in the chamber for the Canadian curling champions from Saskatchewan. We had thought that it might have been arranged for Friday which would have been a more satisfactory date, however, for a variety of reasons this was not possible. For a variety of reasons it isn't possible to have it next week. Consequently arrangements have been made to have the reception here in the chamber tomorrow afternoon at 4:30 o'clock. Since I may add, we have last talked about it, another sports champion from the province in the person of Mr. Glasser of Regina who has won a Canadian bowling championship and we have decided to include recognition of him in the ceremony at the same time.

ANNOUNCEMENT: RE RECIPROCITY AGREEMENT

Hon. A.E. Blakeney (Provincial Treasurer): — Mr. Speaker, before the orders of the day, I would like to advise the house with respect to a matter which was the subject of a question on the orders of the day earlier in the session and dealing with reciprocity with the province of Ontario with respect to long distance traffic. I would advise the house that I have executed on behalf of the government an agreement with the province of Ontario which will have the effect of lowering the license fees which will be payable by Saskatchewan truckers in Ontario and by Ontario truckers in Saskatchewan, by a substantial amount, by some 60 per cent. This with the hope of encouraging more long distance trucking in Canada.
