CANADIAN PACIFIC RAILWAY LABOUR DISPUTE MOTION

Leave of the Assembly having been granted, pursuant to rule 61, it was moved by Mr. Wotherspoon:

That this Legislative Assembly recognizes the critical importance of rail access to the Saskatchewan economy, including to producers and ranchers, miners, energy workers, forestry workers and exporters;

That a rail stoppage would be devastating at this time; and

That the Assembly recognizes the collective bargaining rights of workers; and

That the Assembly calls upon the Canadian Pacific Railway to urgently negotiate a fair deal and to ensure Saskatchewan products keep moving to market without a rail stoppage.

A debate arising, it was moved by the Hon. Mr. Moe:

That all words after “that a rail stoppage would be devastating at this time, and” be struck and replaced with:

That this Legislative Assembly calls on the federal government to:

(1) Immediately implement back-to-work legislation should a work stoppage and disruption of a rail service occur; and

(2) Introduce legislation to designate rail service as an essential service to prevent future rail disruptions caused by labour disputes.

The following question was given notice on day no. 30 and is to be answered by day no. 35:

Question no. 28 (Ms. Wilson):

To the Minister of SaskBuilds and Procurement, re: SPS-RFP-0484 Individual Digital ID Solution and Service Offering, "This Request for Proposal (RFP) is an invitation by the Government of Saskatchewan (GOS) to prospective Proponents to submit proposals for the provision of the solutions and services encompassed in the Saskatchewan Individual Digital Identity Roadmap, as further described in the RFP Particulars (Appendix A). GOS is seeking a long- term partner to design, build, test, implement, roll out, and operate a level of assurance three (LOA3)2 digital identity, in collaboration with the GOS digital partner network;" (a) who are the partners in the GOS Digital Partner Network, (b) what individual information is proposed to be attached to each Individual Digital ID, (c) what is the Saskatchewan Individual Digital Identity Roadmap and where can the public view it, (d) what form of consultation, if any, did the government use to obtain the consent of the Saskatchewan electorate to implement Individual Digital Identification, and (e) has SPS-RFP-0484 tender been awarded to any company?
