Petitions of citizens of the province of Saskatchewan were presented and laid upon the Table by the following members: Sarauer and Ritchie.

READING AND RECEIVING PETITIONS

According to order and pursuant to rule 16(7), petitions from residents of the province of Saskatchewan, requesting the following action, were read and received:

To immediately recruit an appropriate complement of pediatric gastroenterology specialists and adjunct services.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bill was introduced, read the first time, and by leave of the Assembly and pursuant to rule 75(1), ordered to be read a second time immediately:

Bill No. 139 — The Saskatchewan Remembrance Observance Act

(Hon. Mr. McMorris)

Moved by the Hon. Mr. McMorris: That Bill No. 139 — The Saskatchewan Remembrance Observance Act be now read a second time.

A debate arising and the question being put, it was agreed to and the said bill was accordingly read a second time and committed to a Committee of the Whole on Bills immediately.

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE ON BILLS

And, that the Assembly does not support the agenda outlined in the Speech from the Throne because it fails to include adequate measures to address the cost-of-living crisis and the healthcare crisis the people of Saskatchewan are facing; and further,

That the Assembly has lost confidence in the government.

The debate continuing on the motion and the amendment, pursuant to rule 6(7), the Deputy Speaker adjourned the Assembly.
