PRESENTING PETITIONS

Petitions of citizens of the province of Saskatchewan were presented and laid upon the Table by the following members: Francis, Nippi-Albright, Clarke, and Sarauer.

READING AND RECEIVING PETITIONS

According to order and pursuant to rule 16(7), petitions from residents of the province of Saskatchewan, requesting the following action, were read and received:

To protect the Duncairn Reservoir Migratory Bird Sanctuary from any proposed expansion of irrigation.

To provide adequate, sustainable, and predictable operating funds for Saskatchewan's 27 public and separate school divisions.

To fund In Vitro Fertilization (IVF) treatments in Saskatchewan.

To immediately address the short-staffing crisis in health care.

To recognize the Timber Bay school as a provincially run residential school and release the school records to the survivors.

and the proposed amendment thereto moved by Mr. Wotherspoon, seconded by Ms. Conway:

That all the words after "Assembly" be omitted and that the following be inserted:

does not approve the budgetary policy of the government because it fails to provide cost-of-living relief for families; and, further,

That the Assembly has lost confidence in the government.

The debate continuing on the motion and the amendment, the Assembly recessed from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m.

The debate being resumed on the motion and the amendment, pursuant to rule 6(7), the Deputy Chair of Committees of the Whole Assembly interrupted proceedings and adjourned the Assembly.

The Assembly adjourned at 10:30 p.m. until Tuesday at 1:30 p.m.
