Petitions of citizens of the province of Saskatchewan were presented and laid upon the Table by the following members: Matt Love, Darlene Rowden, Jordan McPhail, Betty Nippi-Albright, and Joan Pratchler.

READING AND RECEIVING PETITIONS

According to order and pursuant to rule 16(7), petitions from residents of the province of Saskatchewan, requesting the following action, were read and received:

To immediately renew the Federal-Provincial Child Care Agreement to save jobs, help families and boost our economy.

does not approve the budgetary policy of the government because it proposes cuts to health care and education while failing to respond to the threat and impact of tariffs, including those imposed by Donald Trump; and further,

That the Assembly has lost confidence in the government.

The debate continuing on the motion and the amendment, the Assembly recessed from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m.

The debate being resumed on the motion and the amendment, pursuant to rule 6(7), the Speaker interrupted proceedings and adjourned the Assembly.
