STATEMENT BY THE SPEAKER

Question of Privilege (Deferral of Ruling)

This morning, at 10:22 a.m., I received a letter from the Deputy Opposition House Leader (Kim Breckner) in which she raised a question of privilege in accordance with the provisions of rule 12 of the *Rules and Procedures of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan*. The Government House Leader (Hon. Tim McLeod) has been informed of the details of the case and has provided me with a written response in accordance with rule 12(4).

It is my duty as Speaker to carefully examine the case in the context of the Assembly's practices and precedents to determine whether a *prima facie* case of privilege has been established. As I have not yet had sufficient time to do so, I shall defer my ruling until tomorrow.
