In 2016, AE developed five expectations for the sector to provide direction through budget letters and business plans. In 2018, the first set of data was released on post-secondary indicators. Public indicator reports continue to be published and can be found online. In 2020, the five expectations for the post-secondary sector became the basis for a sector-wide performance framework developed with 16 post-secondary institutions. In 2021, AE began publishing enrolment and credential data on the Saskatchewan.ca dashboard. 	Not applicable, this has been implemented	Not applicable, this has been implemented.

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			•	In 2021, the Ministry launched three accountability initiatives to improve oversight and accountability for government's investment in post-secondary education: o the Post-Secondary Education Sector Performance Framework; the Saskatchewan Post-secondary Multi-year Funding Memorandum of Understanding (MOU); and The Post-Secondary Education and Skills Training Act, 2022. Beginning in 2021, the Ministry received and reviewed annual Performance Framework reports and Multi-Year Funding Accountability reports from 16 post-secondary institutions. Based on the five expectations for the sector, the Performance Framework required institutions to select, report on, and assess indicators that align with both their own strategic plans and priorities		

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			 and government's priorities, such as those outlined in the Growth Plan. The Ministry also met with representatives from these institutions to discuss the results of the Performance Framework reports, including successes and barriers. As part of the Performance Framework reporting, starting in June 2022, in addition to providing data updates to their metrics and including targets, where applicable, institutions began providing highlevel (green, yellow, red) assessments on the progress of their metrics to meet government priorities. As an additional requirement of the Multi-Year Funding agreement, annual Multi-Year Funding Accountability reporting was required by all signatory institutions. This reporting was focused on demonstration of the impact of the \$60M in targeted funding provided by government 		

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			over the first two years of the agreement. • Last year, as part of the extension of the current multi-year funding agreement, the Ministry required institutions to submit accountability plans that will outline the strategic actions they are taking in alignment with the Ministry's three goals. Institutions will report progress on		
			these actions annually.
