CORRECTION OF PRESS REPORT

(Oil Company Investigation)

Mr. Ross A. McCarthy (Cannington): — Mr. Speaker, I would like to call attention to the fact that something I brought up on the Orders of the Day on Friday was reported in the press, as saying that I asked that the reference be broad enough to include all the companies in the southeast. I certainly did not say that. I agree with the Premier that we have a lot of oil companies down there that are doing a good job. What I did say was that it should be broad enough to take in all the companies in the southeast where there is a suspicion of misrepresentation, and that is quite a different thing from taking in all the companies in the southeast. I certainly know the people I represent would not want me to say that. I wouldn't want to say it myself, and I agree with the Premier that many of those companies should not be disturbed. But there are certain exceptions, and those are the ones that I suggest that the terms should be broad enough to take in.
