WELCOME TO STUDENTS

Mrs. Strum: (Saskatoon City) — Mr. Speaker, before the orders of the day are called I would like to draw the attention of the house to a group of 37 students in the west gallery from the Howard Code school, Saskatoon, with their teacher, Mr. Hayes. Mr. Speaker: — Before the orders of the day I would like to inform the members of the house, that I have received a reply from His Honor the Lieutenant Governor, thanking the house for the birthday greetings which they sent to him the other day.

SECOND READINGS

Hon. Mr. Kramer moved second reading of Bill No. 46 — An Act to amend the Game Act.

He said:

In moving second reading, Mr. Speaker, I want to inform the members of the house, that the changes in this Act, are not anything that change in any way the principle of the Act. There is only one departure that is new, and this is in regard to hunter safety training. Questions that hon. members may have, I will be pleased to answer them on third reading, therefore, I move that this Bill be now read a second time.

Motion agreed to and bill read the second time.

Hon. Mr. Blakeney moved second reading of Bill No. 49 — An Act to amend the Mutual Medical and Hospital Benefits Association Act.

He said:

Mr. Speaker, this Bill is a Bill to amend the Mutual Medical and Hospitalization Benefits Association Act. The Bill as members will have noted, is fairly short. It deals with relatively technical matters, dealing with the procedure to be followed on the change or alteration of the powers or the constitutions of such associations. A clarification of the borrowing powers of the associations and provision with respect to who may be qualified to sit on the board of directors of the associations.

I believe that each of the matters would best be considered in committee, and accordingly, Mr. Speaker, I would move that the bill be now read a second time.

Mr. Gardiner: (Melville) — If I might just ask the Minister a question on this, whether the organizations concerned have requested these changes?

Hon. Mr. Blakeney: — Yes, in answer to the hon. member's question, I would indicate that yes, the organizations concerned have requested, I think, each of the changes provided for.

Motion agreed to and Bill read the second time.
