QUESTION RE RETURN 102 — AND PUBLIC SERVICE SUPERANNUATION ACT

Mr. J. H. Brockelbank (Acting Leader of the Opposition, Kelsey): — Mr. Speaker before the orders of the day are proceeded with I would like to remind the Minister of Labour, (Mr. Coderre) that yesterday I was informed that return 102 was on the way. it hasn't arrived yet would he keep chasing it, and, second I would like to ask about the legislation in regard to the Public Service Superannuation Act. As you know at Ottawa, it has passed the House of Commons, it hasn't passed the Senate.
