FIRST REPORT OF SELECT STANDING COMMITTEE ON CROWN CORPORATIONS

Mr. G.G. Leith (Elrose): — Mr. Speaker, before the Orders of the Day I would like to inform the Assembly that due to an unintentional error the following paragraph was not included in the Report of the Select Standing Committee on Crown Corporations which was tabled yesterday:

Your Committee recommends that all feasible efforts be taken to avoid duplication of power generating facilities, resulting from installation of prime generating facilities in major school and hospital projects in the province.

I hereby table the said paragraph to be part of the Report and I move that the first Report of the Select Standing Committee on Crown Corporations be now concurred in.
