QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Ms. Eagles asked the Government Question No. 1027, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Crofford:

To the Minister of Community Resources and Employment: Is Valley View Centre in Moose Jaw scheduled to be closed in the next five years?

Answer:

There is no plan to close Valley View Centre in the next five years.

Mr. D'Autremont asked the Government Question No. 1028, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Atkinson:

To the Minister Responsible for Crown Management Board: (1) How much was paid in salaries and bonuses to the presidents/chief executive officers and vice-presidents of the Crown Investments Corporation and all of its wholly owned subsidiaries for 2004? (2) What is the salary and bonus structure for presidents/chief executive officers and vice-presidents of the Crown Investments Corporation and all of its wholly owned subsidiaries?

Answer:

- (1) Beginning with fiscal year 2003, the Crown and Central Agencies Committee began requiring that CIC and each of its subsidiary Crowns provide names and amounts for all Crown employees who receive more than \$50,000 annually in salary and taxable benefits. CIC is in the process of compiling this information for 2004. It will provide the information when CIC appears before the Committee this year. So far, a date has not yet been set for CIC's appearance. As well, all Crown CEOs and executives who report to the CEOs, are required to file details of their salary and benefits packages with the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly per *The Crown Employment Contracts Act*. The most current information for each executive has been filed.
- (2) Crown CEO's and executives who report to CEO's are required to file details of their salary and benefit packages with the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly per *The Crown Employments Contract Act*. Every individual's filing includes the salary range for his/her position.

Answer:

SaskPower's electronic information management system does not track and record "renovations" individually from other operating, maintenance and administration costs. The process to segregate details that just pertain to renovations would be manual. Extracting that information would be time consuming and costly. SaskPower's facilities consist of: 193 various service centres, region and district offices, vehicle and equipment storage facilities, a system control centre, 15 generating stations, 53 switching stations, 169 substations and approximately 50 pole yards.

Specific to the SaskPower head office: It is more than 40 years old and in order to ensure the building remains a good asset for the province, the building requires ongoing maintenance, repairs and renovations. In 2004, SaskPower's actual operating costs for the head office building was \$2,411,113. This amount was \$154,816 under budget. Operating costs covered a number of activities: asbestos abatement, painting, mechanical, electrical, millwork, building and janitorial supplies, security, window cleaning, etc.
