Mr. Dearborn asked the Government Question No. 1230, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Prebble:

To the Minister of Government Relations: What is the procedure for private fire-fighting companies employing non-unionized staff to receive accreditation for their skills and professional standards from the provincial fire commissioner?

Answer:

The Office of the Fire Commissioner has been accredited by the International Fire Service Accreditation Congress (IFSAC) to certify Saskatchewan fire fighters in accordance with a number of NFPA Standards. As described by IFSAC's Bylaws, the accredited agency must make certification available to all members of the fire service. There is no discrimination between unionized, non-unionized or private industrial companies seeking certification. The certification program is voluntary where members of any fire department can pursue certification if so desired. The system of certification in place under the Office of the Fire Commissioner offers certification or recognition of training for both municipal fire services and industrial fire brigades.

Mr. Dearborn asked the Government Question No. 1231, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Prebble:

To the Minister of Government Relations: (1) What is the nature of the relationship between the standards for fire fighting in the oil field and petroleum industry, as monitored by Occupational Health and Safety and the office of the Fire Commissioner with regards to these standards? (2) If a relationship does not exist, has the Minister taken steps to outline the relationship?

Answer:

(1) The Occupational Health and Safety Branch establishes standards for workplace safety. Part XXXII of *The Occupational Health and Safety Regulations* "Additional Protection for Fire Fighters" introduced the Code of Practice for Fire Fighters in 1997. Section 480 of The Code of Practice states that this part "applies to fire fighters who are engaged in emergency operations on a full or part time basis and their employers, but does not apply to (a) fire fighters fighting prairie or forest fires and (b) fighting fires underground at mines." Part XXXII would apply to those employed in fighting fires in the petroleum industry.

The Code of Practice also makes reference to training of fire fighters under section 482(1), "An employer shall ensure that: (a) all fire fighters receive the training necessary to ensure that the fire fighter is able to carry out safely any emergency operation that the fire fighter will be expected to carry out; (b) the training required by clause (a) is provided by competent persons; and (c) a written record is kept of all training delivered to fire fighters pursuant to this Part." Although there is no specific reference to training standards in this section, the Appendix makes reference to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA). On this matter, Occupational Health and Safety has coordinated standards with those established by the Office of the Fire Commissioner for training and qualification of fire fighters. The standards for fire fighting used by both Occupational Health and Safety and the Office of the Fire Commissioner are the NFPA Professional Qualification Standards.
