Answer:

Saskatchewan Co-operative Fisheries Ltd. is understood to be Saskatchewan Co-operative Fisheries (2002) Ltd. The provincial government has invested \$240,000 through grants, loans, subsidies, debt guarantees or other in Saskatchewan Co-operative Fisheries (2002) Ltd. since 2002-03, the year in which the co-operative was incorporated. This includes \$70,000 in 2005-06 of which \$20,000 has been approved but not yet disbursed.

School buildings are subject to Clause 11 of *The Tobacco Control Act*, which prohibits smoking in “an enclosed public place”. *The Tobacco Control Act* does not restrict smoking in outdoor spaces. Policies with respect to smoking on outdoor school property would be determined by local school boards.

- (2) Newsletters and e-mail distribution through associations including the Saskatoon Human Resources Association, Saskatchewan Environmental Industry and Managers Association, and the Saskatchewan Trade and Export Partnership:
 - 1,623 businesses and employers reached
- (3) Presentations by the Minister or officials to business and employer associations including the North Saskatoon Business Association, Moose Jaw Chamber of Commerce, Saskatchewan Chamber of

Commerce, Saskatoon Human Resources Association, and the Ukrainian Professional Business Association:

189 businesses and employers reached

- (4) Survey—A SINP question was included in a survey conducted by the Saskatoon Regional Economic Development Authority (SREDA):

850 businesses and employers reached

- (5) SINP information packages have been sent to business associations including Swift Current and Radville for distribution:

25 businesses and employers reached

Total businesses, employers and associations contacted to date in 2005 are estimated at approximately 3,270.
