QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Mr. Hermanson asked the Government Question No. 168, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Sonntag:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Telecommunications: (1) As of December 31, 2003, how many MAX TV subscribers were employees of SaskTel? (2) Do SaskTel employees receive a discounted subscription rate for the MAX TV service? (3) If so, how much is the employees' discount, per employee? (4) What is the total discount amount?

Answer:

- (1)998
- (2) Yes
- (3) Employees receive approximately \$8/month discount on the TV component of Basic Max.
- (4) 998 employees at \$8/month discount would be a total discount of \$7,984 for the month.

Mr. Hermanson asked the Government Question No. 169, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Sonntag:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Telecommunications: Can the Minister provide an explanation as to why SaskTel can release the number of subscribers for its MAX TV service, yet does not release the number of disconnects due to what is termed "competitive reasons"?

Answer:

In this industry, companies do not release customer churn by service or product on a provincial basis. In a competitive industry, churn can indicate success of promotional and product offerings. Releasing this information could lead to a competitive disadvantage.

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation: How many fulland part-time positions will be lost within SPMC due to the budget?

Answer:

A total of 23 full-time and 45 part-time positions have been reduced at SPMC due to the budget. An additional seven vacant positions were also reduced.

Answer:

The Saskatchewan Board is co-operating with the Chicken Farmers of Canada (CFC) who is taking the lead on working with the British Columbia Chicken Board to step up production over the next six months.

There is no requirement for issuance of Broiler Hatching Egg Quota.
