MOTION FOR A SEVENTY-FIVE MINUTE DEBATE

That all words after "Assembly" be deleted and substituted with the following:

"recognizes that this year's provincial Budget has increased the funding for health care by \$160 million, and

that the top priority of the Government of Saskatchewan is to use the means available to deliver high quality services like home care, long term care, the drug plan and acute care, which are all a top priority of the people of Saskatchewan."

The debate continuing and the period of seventy-five minutes having expired pursuant to Rule 19(5), the Acting Speaker interrupted proceedings.
