INTERIM SUPPLY

That a sum not exceeding one billion, twenty million, five hundred twenty-six thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, on account, for the twelve months ending March 31, 2005.

A debate arising and the question being put, it was agreed to.

On motion of the Hon. Mr. Van Mulligen:

Resolved, That towards making good the supply granted to Her Majesty, on account, of certain charges and expenses of the public service for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2005, the sum of one billion, twenty million, five hundred twenty-six thousand dollars be granted out of the General Revenue Fund.

The said resolutions were reported, read twice and agreed to, and the Committee given leave to sit again.

THE APPROPRIATION ACT, 2004 (No. 2)

Moved by the Hon. Mr. Van Mulligen, by leave of the Assembly: That Bill No. 42 – The Appropriation Act, 2004 (No. 2) – be introduced and read the first time.

The question being put, it was agreed to and the said Bill was, accordingly, read the first time.

By leave of the Assembly and pursuant to Rule 57(2), the said Bill was then read a second and third time and passed under its title.

Her Honour the Lieutenant Governor then replied: "In Her Majesty's name, I thank the Legislative Assembly, accept their benevolence, and assent to this Bill."

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Ms. Harpauer asked the Government Question No. 234, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Wartman:

To the Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Revitalization: (1) How many extension agrologists were employed by the Government of Saskatchewan on April 1, 2004? (2) How many will be employed by the Government of Saskatchewan as of May 1, 2004?

Answer:

- (1) On April 1, 2004 the department had 157 agrologist positions.
- (2) The department expects to have 141 agrologist positions as of May 1, 2004.

Mr. Dearborn asked the Government Question No. 235, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Wartman:

To the Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Revitalization: (1) Will Saskatchewan chicken producers, currently on the waiting list to be granted quotas in our province to supply chickens, be granted those quotas in an expedited manner in order to supply the increased need for chickens due to the cull of 19 million birds? (2) What is the time frame from the granting of these new quotas?

Answer:

The Saskatchewan Board is co-operating with the CFC (Chicken Farmers of Canada) who is taking the lead on working with the British Columbia Chicken Board to step up production over the next six months. There is no requirement for issuance of Broiler Hatching Egg quota.

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation: What was the revenue generated by the Echo Valley Conference Centre, and what were the operating expenses incurred by this facility in the fiscal year 2002-2003?

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation: What was the revenue generated by the Echo Valley Conference Centre, and what were the operating expenses incurred by this facility in the fiscal year 2001-2002?
