To the Minister Responsible for Information Services Corporation: (1) During fiscal year 2002-2003, what was the name of the report that resulted from the Gartner Group study recommending an appropriate governance model for geomatics services within the provincial government? (2) What were the costs associated with this study? (3) What were the results of the study? (4) Will the Minister table this report in the Assembly?

Answer:

- (1) Geomatics Governance Report 2002
- (2) The Gartner Group was engaged jointly by Information Services Corporation (ISC) and the Information Technology Office (ITO). The cost of the Report was shared 50/50 between ISC and ITO. The total cost of the Report was \$95,824.86. The cost of the Report to ISC was \$47,912.43.
- (3) There were 19 recommendations in the Report. 17 of the 19 recommendations are being or have been implemented. The remaining two recommendations will be acted on in future.
