## **QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS**

## Mr. Dearborn asked the Government Question No. 240, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Ouennell:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Power Corporation: (1) What is the minimum rate charge for a disconnect and reconnect for a commercial customer, specifically around seasonal buildings? (2) How is this rate determined?

#### Answer:

- (1) The rate charged for a seasonal disconnect/reconnect for general service accounts is \$155.00 (plus GST) and \$105.00 (plus GST) for each subsequent meter that is disconnected for the same customer at the same location during one trip.
- (2) The rate recovers the costs associated with seasonal disconnects. These costs include labour, vehicles, tools, equipment, administrative costs and infrastructure maintenance.

## Mr Dearborn asked the Government Question No. 241, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Atkinson:

To the Minister Responsible for the Public Service Commission: Does the 2004 provincial budget wage increase mandate of 0% - 1% - 1% for year one, year two and year three extend to the various types of Crown Corporations as defined in section 2(c), (e), (f), (f.1), (h) and (i) of *The Crown Corporations Act*, 1993, S.S. c - 50.101?

#### Answer:

The wage mandate applies to all Crown corporations as defined in those sections of the Crown Corporations Act, 1993.

## Mr Brkich asked the Government Question No. 243, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Higgins:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation: (1) Does SPMC purchase any of the natural gas it uses in its properties in Saskatchewan from a company other than SaskEnergy? (2) If so, which properties use gas from a different company?

### Answer:

- (1) No
- (2) N/A

## Mr McMorris asked the Government Question No. 244, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Higgins:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation: What was the revenue generated by the Echo Valley Conference Centre, and what were the operating expenses incurred by this facility in the fiscal year 2002-2003?

### Answer:

The 2002-2003 total revenues for Echo Valley Conference Centre were \$1,471,143 and the total expenses were \$2,299,203.

## Mr McMorris asked the Government Question No. 245, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Higgins:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation: What was the revenue generated by the Echo Valley Conference Centre, and what were the operating expenses incurred by this facility in the fiscal year 2001-2002?

#### Answer:

The 2001-02 total revenue for Echo Valley Conference Centre was \$1,332,821 and the total expenses were \$2,296,786.

## Mr Gantefoer asked the Government Question No. 246, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Van Mulligen:

To the Minister of Health: How much money did the provincial government spend on the post-budget mail-out to Saskatchewan residents entitled Budget 2004-2005: *Understanding Health Care Spending in Saskatchewan?* 

#### Answer:

The provincial government spent approximately \$60,000 to design, print and distribute *Budget 2004-05:Understanding Health Care in Saskatchewan*.

# Mr Gantefoer asked the Government Question No. 247, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Van Mulligen:

To the Minister of Finance: (1) How much money did the provincial government receive from the federal government for the Canada Health Infoway in the fiscal years of 2001-2002, 2002-2003, and 2003-2004? (2) How much of this money was allocated to the provincial health budget in each respective year?

### Answer:

(1) The following sums were received in the three fiscal years:

Fiscal year	Amount (\$)
2001-02	\$0
2002-03	\$191,706
2003-04	\$1,596,046

(2) Canada Health Infoway (Infoway) does not provide annual 'grant' funding. Instead, Infoway reimburses the Saskatchewan Health Information Network (SHIN) for a portion of costs that we incur in Saskatchewan for approved health IT projects which meet Infoway's investment criteria. Funding is received from Infoway as project phases are completed and the funding goes directly to SHIN as reimbursement for the costs incurred. These funds do not therefore come into the provincial budget as revenues.

## Mr Gantefoer asked the Government Question No. 248, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Van Mulligen:

To the Minister of Finance: (1) How much money did or will the provincial government receive from the federal government for the Canada Health Infoway in the fiscal year of 2004-2005? (2) How much of this money was or will be allocated to the provincial health budget?

#### Answer:

- (1) Saskatchewan Health is currently in discussions with Infoway about some projects that we expect will begin this year. The outcome of these discussions and the subsequent project planning work with Infoway will determine what funding SHIN will receive this year from Infoway in 2004-05.
- (2) Canada Health Infoway (Infoway) does not provide annual 'grant' funding. Instead, Infoway reimburses the Saskatchewan Health Information Network (SHIN) for a portion of costs that we incur in Saskatchewan for approved health IT projects which meet Infoway's investment criteria. Funding is received from Infoway as project phases are completed and the funding goes directly to SHIN as reimbursement for the costs incurred. These funds do not therefore come into the provincial budget as revenues.
