QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Mr. Hart asked the Government Question No. 251, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Higgins:

To the Minister of Labour: For all the cases before the Labour Relations Board in which a final decision was handed down in 2003: (1) What was the average length of time between the case being heard by the Labour Relations Board and the final decision being made? (2) What was the longest period between the hearing of a case and a final decision? (3) What was the shortest?

Answer:

The following is for the fiscal year 2003/04 and is broken down into certification/rescission applications as one category and all other applications as another category.

In the fiscal year April 1, 2003 to March 31, 2004:

For Certification/Rescission Applications: The average time between last hearing date and final decision was 4 days. The longest period between last hearing date and final decision was 99 days and the shortest period between last hearing date and final decision was 0 days (ie. the decision was rendered on the same day as the last hearing date).

For All Other Applications: The average time between last hearing date and final decision was 100 days. The longest period between last hearing date and final decision was 928 days and the shortest period between last hearing date and final decision was 0 days (ie. the decision was rendered on the same day as the last hearing date).

Mr. Hart asked the Government Question No. 252, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Higgins:

To the Minister of Labour: For all the cases before the Labour Relations Board in which a final decision was handed down in 2002: (1) What was the average length of time between the case being heard by the Labour Relations Board and the final decision being made? (2) What was the longest period between the hearing of a case and a final decision? (3) What was the shortest?

Answer:

The following is for the fiscal year 2002/03 and is broken down into certification/rescission applications as one category and all other applications as another category.

In the fiscal year April 1, 2002 to March 31, 2003:

For Certification/Rescission Applications: The average time between last hearing date and final decision was 8 days. The longest period between last hearing date and final decision was 118 days and the shortest period between last hearing date and final decision was 0 days (ie. the decision was rendered on the same day as the last hearing date).

For All Other Applications: The average time between last hearing date and final decision was 56 days. The longest period between last hearing date and final decision was 421 days and the shortest period between last hearing date and final decision was 0 days (ie. the decision was rendered on the same day as the last hearing date).

Mr. Hermanson asked the Government Question No. 253, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Sonntag:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Telecommunications: For the year 2003, what amount of money did SaskTel spend on advertising: (1) MAX TV services? (2) High-speed internet? (3) Other SaskTel services?

Answer:

SaskTel does not release advertising costs for its individual lines of business as it is competitive information. However, SaskTel's 2003 overall advertising budget was approximately \$14 million, which included all communication costs for such things as MAX, High Speed Internet, Cellular, Long Distance, Employment, Tendering, Data Products, SecurTek, SmartTouch, Managed Information Services, eCommerce, Business Solutions and Customer Information.

Mr. Weekes asked the Government Question No. 254, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Crofford:

To the Minister of Community Resources and Employment: For fiscal year 2004-2005, what is the annual maximum dental allowance for individuals who have been given Supplementary Health Benefits?

Community Resources and Employment does not deliver the Supplementary Health Benefits program.
