(2) In which regional editions of the *Globe and Mail* did this supplement appear? (3) How many of the articles which appeared were placed for free?

Answer:

- (1) \$98,000.00
- (2) All regional editions of the Globe and Mail newspaper carried the supplement.
- (3) All articles were placed as part of the supplement.
