Ms. Bakken asked the Government Question No. 324 which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Higgins:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Property Management Corporation: What was the cost of the study entitled "Premarket Evaluation Study for Souris Valley Regional Care Centre, Weyburn", completed in February 2004 by NAI Commercial Real Estate Services Ltd.?

Answer:

This information cannot be released, in accordance with a confidentiality clause within the contract.

(3) If not, what is SPMC's next step in finding a buyer, alternative tenant or alternative use for this facility? (4) If a buyer or alternative use for this facility is not in place by December 31, 2004, what is SPMC's plan for this facility?

Answer:

- (3) SPMC will be marketing the property to the private sector.
- (4) December 31, 2004 is not a specified date for any of SPMC's plans with regard to this facility, however the corporation will decommission the facility once it has been vacated by the health district in the fall of 2004.
