QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Mr. Heppner asked the Government Question No. 358 which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Nilson:

To the Minister of Health: Will proposed legislation banning smoking in public places be applicable to and enforced on Saskatchewan reserves?

Answer:

The Tobacco Control Amendment Act, 2004 is a law of general application and does apply on reserve land.

Mr. Gantefoer asked the Government Question No. 392, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Nilson:

To the Minister of Health: (1) Can the Minister please provide the criteria that the Regina Qu'Appelle Health Authority uses to award units of physiotherapy service contracts with privately operated physiotherapy clinics? (2) Is this criteria consistent with how other health authorities award physiotherapy service contracts?

Answer:

- (1) For the past number of years the Regina Qu'Appelle Regional Health Authority has used a tender process to award contracts for outpatient physiotherapy. The criteria used includes 17 categories (total points 100) ranging from:
 - qualifications of staff
 - supervisory experience
 - safety procedures
 - policies
 - length of time/experience as a clinic
 - infection control
 - statistical and outcome monitoring etc.

Contracts are awarded on this criteria and the total number of points scored.

(2) Each regional health authority that contracts with physiotherapy clinics, establishes its own criteria for clinic selection

Mr. Gantefoer asked the Government Question No. 393, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Nilson:

To the Minister of Health: (1) How many private physiotherapy clinics applied for service contracts with the Regina Qu'Appelle Health District in the new term beginning April 1, 2004? (2) How many received contracts?

Answer:

- (1) For 2004/05 the Regina Qu'Appelle Regional Health Authority received nine applications for physiotherapy contracts.
- (2) Contracts were awarded to seven clinics.

Mr. Gantefoer asked the Government Ouestion No. 394, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Nilson:

To the Minister of Health: Who assesses private physiotherapy clinics who have applied for service contracts with the Regina Qu'Appelle Health District to determine if they meet all of the eligibility requirements?

Answer:

The regional health authority assesses the applicant using the criteria referenced in Question No. 392.

Mr. Gantefoer asked the Government Question No. 395, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Nilson:

To the Minister of Health: If a private physiotherapy clinic has applied for a service contract and does not meet the eligibility requirements of the Regina Qu'Appelle Health District, is the operator notified as to the deficiencies of the clinic so they may improve their eligibility status in subsequent years?

Answer:

Applicants are notified as to whether they are successful or unsuccessful. Unsuccessful applications may request information about why they were not selected.

Mr. Gantefoer asked the Government Question No. 396, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Nilson:

To the Minister of Health: What are the eligibility requirements for pre-authorized out-of-province medical treatment?

Answer:

The vast majority of out-of-province services within Canada are provided using the Inter-provincial Reciprocal Billing Agreement, and no pre-authorization is required. Magnetic resonance imaging and cataract services are only insured with prior approval from Saskatchewan Health. In order to be considered eligible for out-of-province approval, a written request by the patient's attending specialist is required. Within this request, confirmation regarding the medical necessity of the service, and that the service is not able to be performed as required in Saskatchewan, is requested.

Mr. Gantefoer asked the Government Question No. 397, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Nilson:

To the Minister of Health: (1) Is there a formal appeal process for people who have been denied preauthorized out-of-province medical treatment? (2) If so, what is the process?

Answer:

- (1) Yes
- (2) When a decision has been made to deny coverage for out-of-province health treatment, an appeal may be made to the Executive Director of the Medical Services Branch, Saskatchewan Department of Health. The review of the appeal is based on whether an individual was treated unfairly within the established criteria, or additional information or data that was not available when the request for out-of-province coverage was requested.

Ms. Harpauer asked the Government Question No. 401, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Sonntag:

To the Minister of Highways and Transportation: (1) For fiscal year 2003-2004, what was the total number of appeal applications made to the Highway Traffic Board? Answer:
