QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Mr. Brkich asked the Government Question No. 441 which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Cline:

To the Minister Responsible for Investment Saskatchewan: How much money does the government have invested in Heartland Hog Barns?

Answer:

Investment Saskatchewan currently has investments in two Heartland Hog Barns for a total of \$2.2 million.

SaskTel does not release its costs for installation as it is competitive information.
