To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Water Corporation: In 1998, (1) Whether SaskWater/Spudco received any compensation from Monsanto for any of the genetically modified New Leaf potatoes. (2) If any of this compensation from Monsanto was provided to any of the producers who grew genetically modified New Leaf potatoes. (3) The quantity of genetically modified New Leaf potatoes that each of these potato packaging and processing companies bought. (4) Whether each of these potato packaging and processing companies were informed by SaskWater/Spudco that they were buying genetically modified New Leaf potatoes. (5) The steps SaskWater/Spudco took to inform consumers in Saskatchewan and other markets that they were eating genetically modified New Leaf potatoes. (6) Whether any genetically modified New Leaf potatoes were ever mixed with other varieties of potatoes before being shipped and sold by SaskWater/Spudco. (7) If so, which producers received this compensation and how much each received.

A debate arising and the question being put, it was agreed to and an Order of the Assembly issued.

Moved by Mr. Hermanson, seconded by Ms. Draude: That an Order of the Assembly do issue for a **Return No. 319** showing:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Water Corporation: In 1998, (1) The quantity of genetically modified New Leaf potatoes that SaskWater/Spudco owned at the beginning of the year. (2) The amount SaskWater/Spudco paid for these genetically modified New Leaf potatoes. (3) The number of producers SaskWater/Spudco sold genetically modified New Leaf potatoes as seed potatoes. (4) The quantity of genetically modified New Leaf potatoes that each of these producers bought. (5) The amount of money SaskWater/Spudco received from each of these producers for these genetically modified New Leaf potatoes. (6) The quantity of genetically modified New Leaf potatoes that each of these producers grew under their agreements with SaskWater/Spudco. (7) The date on which SaskWater/Spudco became aware that the genetically modified New Leaf potatoes were under review by Agriculture Canada.

(8) The date on which SaskWater/Spudco made this Agriculture Canada review known to each of the producers to whom it had sold genetically modified New Leaf potatoes for seed. (9) How SaskWater/Spudco sold or otherwise disposed of all the genetically modified New Leaf potatoes it owned in 1998. (10) The quantity of genetically modified New Leaf potatoes that were sold to potato packaging and processing companies for human consumption. (11) Which potato packaging and processing companies bought genetically modified New Leaf potatoes from SaskWater/Spudco to be sold for human consumption. (12) For each shipment of genetically modified New Leaf potatoes that were sold outside Saskatchewan, whether there was a Ministerial exemption obtained from the federal Department of Agriculture. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Mr. Wakefield asked the Government Question No. 885, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Forbes:

To the Minister of Environment: (1) What changes has SERM made to fisheries management policy since 1997? (2) Have any of these changes involved the devolution of authority to a co-operative or other third party?

Answer:

(1) Several changes have been made to fisheries management policy since 1997 and include: the introduction of a competitive fishing event license in 1999; changes to bait fishing regulations in 1999 and 2003; a lengthened angling season in northern Saskatchewan in 2000; and a 2003 policy that clarifies the Saskatchewan Environment relationship with commercial fishing co-operatives.

(2) No, none of these changes have delegated Ministerial authority to any group. The Department will, however, consider advice and recommendations on fisheries management from third parties.

Mr. Wakefield asked the Government Question No. 886, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Forbes:

To the Minister of Environment: (1) Within SERM, who is responsible for the management of fisheries resources? (2) Have any fisheries resource management functions been devolved? (3) Who is responsible for compliance in fisheries management?

Answer:

(1) Within Saskatchewan Environment (SE), Resource Stewardship Branch is responsible for the management of the provincial fisheries resource.

(2) No fisheries management functions have been devolved.

(3) SE's Compliance and Field Services Branch is responsible for compliance in fisheries management as covered by provincial legislation. Fisheries and Oceans Canada is responsible for compliance with the fish habitat protection provisions of the *Fisheries Act* of Canada.
