PRESENTING PETITIONS

READING AND RECEIVING PETITIONS

According to Order, the Deputy Clerk having favourably reported on the same pursuant to Rule 14(7), the following Petitions were read and received:

Of citizens of the Province of Saskatchewan humbly praying that your Honourable Assembly may be pleased to cause the Government to reconsider the decision to reduce funding to the Claybank Brick Plant.

(Addendum to Sessional Paper No. 180)

Of citizens of the Province of Saskatchewan humbly praying that your Honourable Assembly may be pleased to cause the Government to reverse the decision to force the amalgamation of school divisions in Saskatchewan and continue re-organization of school divisions on a strictly voluntary basis.

(Addendum to Sessional Paper No. 637)

Of citizens of the Province of Saskatchewan humbly praying that your Honourable Assembly may be pleased to cause the Government to immediately address the concerns of all individuals affected by the TransGas Asquith Natural Gas Storage Project, pay 100% of the costs involved to rectify disruptions to water supplies, produce an environment assessment study encompassing a larger area outside the scope of the project, disclose the project's long term effects on these areas and consider alternative sources of water for the project.

BUDGET DEBATE

The Assembly resumed the adjourned debate on the proposed motion of the Hon. Mr. Van Mulligen, seconded by Mr. Hagel:

That the Assembly approves in general the budgetary policy of the Government.

The debate continuing on the motion, it was moved by Mr. Cheveldayoff, seconded by Mr. Krawetz, in amendment thereto:

That all words after “That the Assembly” be deleted and the following substituted therefor:

“disagrees with the general budgetary policy of the government because the Premier and Cabinet have betrayed low and modest income earners by not increasing the basic personal exemption for people who earn less than \$35,000 a year, have not included indexation to the food allowance for people living on social assistance, have pre-determined the outcome of collective bargaining for teachers and nurses, have frozen funding for K-12 education, have not committed to fully fund the province’s share of the Canadian Agriculture Income Stabilization Program, have not addressed revenue sharing with municipalities, and have not laid out a long-term vision for the province for the next 100 years, therefore this provincial government does not enjoy the confidence of this Assembly.”

The debate continuing on the motion and the amendment, it was moved by the Hon. Ms. Atkinson:

“That this Assembly do now adjourn.”

The question being put, it was agreed to and the motion for the adjournment of the debate was deemed to have been made.

The Assembly adjourned at 12:40 p.m. until Wednesday at 1:30 p.m.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Mr. Brkich asked the Government Question No. 909, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Sonntag:

To the Minister of Highways and Transportation: (1) Will the section of Highway 15 between the junction with Highway 20 and the village of Semans be resurfaced during the course of 2005? (2) If so, will this section of Highway 15 be resurfaced to the same standard as the section of Highway 15 east of Semans up to the junction with Highway 6?

Answer:

The department and its municipal partners are currently finalizing plans for work to be conducted in 2005 on this section of Highway 15.

Mr. Dearborn asked the Government Question No. 910, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Sonntag:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Telecommunications: (1) For entry level marketing positions, why are driving licenses a requirement? (2) Does this requirement discriminate against applicants with visual impairments? (3) How many applicants for these positions in the past have been visually impaired, and how many of these applicants have been hired?

Answer:

- (1) Positions require travel to customer sites throughout Saskatchewan for sales presentations, conferences, and meetings.
- (2) No. Accommodations can be made to the job responsibilities or working conditions that provides the employee with the opportunity to perform the duties to the best of their ability.
- (3) We are unable to determine the type of disability or impairment an applicant may have when they apply for employment. However, when individuals are offered employment, they are asked if any type of accommodation is required within the workplace.

Mr. Dearborn asked the Government Question No. 911, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Quennell:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Power Corporation: (1) For entry level marketing positions, why are driving licenses a requirement? (2) Does this requirement discriminate against applicants with visual impairments? (3) How many applicants for these positions in the past have been visually impaired, and how many of these applicants have been hired?

Answer:

- (1) For entry level marketing positions, a driver's licence is not a requirement.
- (2) Marketing Services welcomes applications from all qualified individuals. Since March 2004, one (1) Marketing opportunity has been posted externally. The external posting did not make any reference to Driver's Licence as a requirement therefore no candidates were screened-out. In fact, Marketing Services is looking to develop a more representative workforce and would especially welcome applications from qualified diversity candidates, including those who may be visually impaired.
- (3) Same as Answer No. 2.

Mr. Dearborn asked the Government Question No. 912, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Van Mulligen:

To the Minister Responsible for SaskEnergy Incorporated: (1) For entry level marketing positions, why are driving licenses a requirement? (2) Does this requirement discriminate against applicants with visual impairments? (3) How many applicants for these positions in the past have been visually impaired, and how many of these applicants have been hired?

Answer:

- (1) The Marketing Supervisor position is the entry level position in the department, aside from Administrative support staff and Co-op students. The Marketing Supervisor position requires a driver's licence due to the fact the position involves frequent travel within and between communities throughout Saskatchewan. This travel requirement could not easily be met by other forms of

transportation. Specifically, Marketing Supervisors provide information, training and coaching for 138 Network Members in 62 communities throughout the province. As well, they frequently meet with SaskEnergy staff at 11 SaskEnergy area offices. Their role also requires transporting and setting up equipment, displays and promotional materials in a variety of locations, and training internal and external contacts on a variety of online and other services.

- (2) SaskEnergy positions are open to all individuals who meet the position requirements. Marketing opportunities in the past several years have been filled with internal applicants or by students through the Co-op program that meet the position requirements.
- (3) As we have not hired externally for the Marketing Supervisor position for several years, we are not aware of any visually impaired applicants.

To the Minister of Learning: In view that personal counselling could be considered as mental health treatment, are policies in place by the Department that determine: (1) The minimum age for which a child can receive counselling without parental permission or awareness; and (2) A minimum number of sessions for which a child may consult with a counsellor before parental consent and/or awareness is required?

Ms. Harpauer, to ask the Government the following Question No. 925:

To the Minister of Learning: If it has been determined by a professional worker within the K-12 system that a child may harm him/herself or another student, what protocol does the Department have in place for that professional to follow to: (1) Inform the parents of the child; and (2) Seek professional help for the child?
