BUDGET DEBATE

Moved by the Hon. Mr. Van Mulligen, seconded by Mr. Hagel:

That the Assembly approves in general the budgetary policy of the Government.

A debate arising, it was moved by Mr. Cheveldayoff, seconded by Mr. Krawetz, in amendment thereto:

That all words after "That the Assembly" be deleted and the following substituted therefor:

"disagrees with the general budgetary policy of the government because the Premier and Cabinet have betrayed low and modest income earners by not increasing the basic personal exemption for people who earn less than \$35,000 a year, have not included indexation to the food allowance for people living on social assistance, have pre-determined the outcome of collective bargaining for teachers and nurses, have frozen funding for K-12 education, have not committed to fully fund the province's share of the Canadian Agriculture Income Stabilization Program, have not addressed revenue sharing with municipalities, and have not laid out a long-term vision for the province for the next 100 years, therefore this provincial government does not enjoy the confidence of this Assembly."

The debate continuing on the motion and the amendment, it was on motion of Hon. Mr. Belanger, adjourned.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Ms. Bakken asked the Government Question No. 914, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Crofford:

To the Minister of Community Resources and Employment: When a child is placed in foster care and the Department then learns that the child has become suicidal, what steps does the Department take to ensure the child's safety?

Answer:

Every child in care is assigned a trained professional Social Worker responsible for developing a comprehensive case plan for the child/youth. When a child in care is identified as being suicidal, the department would make a referral to mental health professionals and seek their assistance in assessing the level of risk and developing an immediate plan. The plan could include 24 hour supervision, referral to other specialists for assessment or in severe situations, could include hospitalization to ensure safety. The suicide assessment and subsequent safety planning is vital information and is communicated to everyone involved in caring for the child.

Ms. Bakken asked the Government Question No. 915, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Crofford:

To the Minister of Community Resources and Employment: What are the Department of Community Resources and Employment's policies and procedures for following up on a complaint made by a child against a parent whom the child is living with?

Answer:

The department assesses the validity of all reports of child abuse or neglect whether the report comes from the child or another person. An initial assessment of the report is made to determine whether reasonable grounds exist to believe a child may be in need of protection. An initial investigation may include making collateral contacts with the child's school or other sources to gather information. The purpose of the child protection investigation is to determine whether a child is at significant risk and to determine the best methods of assuring the child's safety. The investigation may involve interviews with the child, interviews with the family and other professionals the family may be involved with. As a result of the child protection investigation, it may be determined that child safety can be maintained in the family home. In other situations, children must be removed temporarily from the home to ensure safety. In situations of allegations of physical or sexual abuse, a joint investigation is conducted with the police or RCMP according to the Provincial Child Abuse Protocol.

Ms. Bakken asked the Government Question No. 916, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Crofford:

To the Minister of Community Resources and Employment: (1) Is it common practice for the Department to place a child with a person who was involved in filing a complaint against the child's parent? (2) If not, what is the common practice for placing a child in foster care?

Answer:

- (1) When children must be placed in out of home care for safety reasons, extended family is explored as a first priority for placement. It is possible that the same family member who initially raised concerns for the child's safety is found to be a safe placement resource for the child. An assessment of the proposed extended family caregiver is conducted to ensure that the home is safe for the child and that the extended family is able to meet the child's needs. The principle of the "best interests of the child" governs all decisions made regarding placement of the child.
- (2) If there is no family member or person of significance to the child that can safely care for the child, an appropriate foster care resource is found.
