QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Mr. Weekes asked the Government Question No. 947, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Sonntag:

To the Minister of Highways and Transportation: (1) Of the 57 km of road improvements to be done under forestry commitments, what is the cost per kilometre? (2) What is/are the location(s) of these kilometres of highway improvement? (3) How often are these Road Transportation Agreements under forestry commitments renegotiated? (4) What is the length of time that these agreements will exist?

Answer:

- (1) The cost per kilometre is approximately \$93,500/km.
- (2) The location of these projects are:
 - Highway 913 – Junction of Highway 120 to 11 km north.
 - Highway 917 – Junction of Highway 916 to 5 km north of East Bay
 - Highway 924 – Junction of Highway 55 to 8 km north
 - Highway 969 – Junction of Highway 2 to 4 km north of Timber Bay
- (3) The department has one Road and Transportation Agreement (RTA). This agreement has no provisions for renegotiation.
- (4) The RTA was entered into in 1986 and exists in perpetuity.

The Saskatchewan government provides \$2.50M for problem gambling. The allocations are:

- Treatment Programs \$1.0M
- Prevention & Education Programs \$1.2M
- Research \$0.1M
- Problem Gambling Consulting Staff \$0.2M

In addition, \$1.5M from SIGA gaming revenues are allocated to the First Nations Rehabilitation Foundation for problem gambling prevention, education and treatment initiatives for First Nations people.
