QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Mr. Brkich asked the Government the following Question No. 33, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Serby:

To the Minister of Regional Economic and Co-operative Development: What are the costs associated with creating, publishing and distributing the *Communities At Work* magazine that is distributed by the Department of Regional Economic and Co-operative Development?

Answer:

Communities At Work is distributed to approximately 225,000 households in Saskatchewan at a cost of approximately 24 cents per copy.
