Mr. Weekes asked the Government the following Question No. 41, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Atkinson:

To the Minister Responsible for Immigration: To date, what is the average processing time for each category of the Saskatchewan Immigration Nominee Program from the point he/she applies to the point that he/she is considered nominated?

Answer:

Since April 1, 2006 there have been 1402 applications.

Applications with complete information are processed within 3 months. However, many of the applications have incomplete or missing information which results in a longer processing time. The average processing time (calendar days) for all SINP nominations, including incomplete applications, from April 1, 2006 to present, and broken down by category:

Now that there are twice as many applicants, there are twice as many applications which are incomplete or missing documents.

* The old "Business" and "Farm" categories were replaced with the new "Entrepreneur" category as of May 2006.

Answer:

For the 2005/06 fiscal year there were 773 applications.

Applications with complete information are processed within 3 months. However, many of the applications have incomplete or missing information which results in a longer processing time. For the 2005/06 fiscal year the average processing time of applications, including incomplete applications, broken down by category:
