QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Mr. Allchurch asked the Government the following Question No. 59, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Cline:

To the Minister Responsible for Investment Saskatchewan Inc.: What is the interest rate for the \$2 million loan to North West Communities Wood Products?

Answer:

It is a fixed, commercial interest rate. Investment Saskatchewan is unable to provide the actual interest rate to protect the commercial interests of Northwest Communities Holdings Ltd.

Mr. Allchurch asked the Government the following Question No. 60, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Cline:

To the Minister Responsible for Investment Saskatchewan Inc.: What is the re-payment schedule for the \$2 million loan to North West Communities Wood Products?

Answer:

The loan is due in 2008. Investment Saskatchewan is unable to provide the re-payment schedule for the \$2 million IS loan with Northwest Communities Holdings Ltd. to protect the commercial interests of the company.

Mr. Allchurch asked the Government the following Question No. 61, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Cline:

To the Minister Responsible for Investment Saskatchewan Inc.: What type of loan was provided to North West Communities Wood Products?

Answer:

A two-year term loan.

Mr. Cheveldayoff asked the Government the following Question No. 62, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Higgins:

To the Minister of Learning: On what date will the 2006 Capital Priority List be released?

Answer:

The 2006 Capital Priority List will be released on December 1, 2006.

The 2006-2010 Major Capital Request List will be ready for release on December 1, 2006. It has been delayed due to additional work required by the department to work with the new school divisions to clarify project requests.

The newly restructured school divisions were unsure of the details of many of the requests made by legacy school divisions. The department and the school divisions required additional time to clarify the nature of these requests and the ongoing need.

Mr. Cheveldayoff asked the Government the following Question No. 63, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Lautermilch:

To the Minister of Property Management: (1) To date, how many floors have been completed in the construction project of the Finance headquarters on College Avenue in Regina? (2) What will be the end number of floors constructed in this project?

Answer:

- (1) Two floors complete - 10th and 11th.
- (2) 12 floors and basement.

The completed upgrades in this facility not specific to a floor include: main floor addition, parking lot, landscaping, mechanical infrastructure, new electrical service, roof replacement, penthouse addition and partial elevator improvements.

Mr. Cheveldayoff asked the Government the following Question No. 64, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Latermilch:

To the Minister of Property Management: What was the total cost estimate from Dominion Construction, approved by the Government of Saskatchewan, for the construction project at the Finance headquarters on College Avenue in Regina?

Answer:

\$13,319,768.20 is the total cost estimate for construction from Dominion Construction.

\$16.5 million is the total project estimate (including construction, design and improvements) approved by the Government of Saskatchewan.

Mr. Cheveldayoff asked the Government the following Question No. 65, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Latermilch:

To the Minister of Property Management: What will be the actual final cost upon completion of the construction project at the Finance headquarters on College Avenue in Regina?

Answer:

Final cost is estimated at \$16.5 million.

Mr. Cheveldayoff asked the Government the following Question No. 66, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Latermilch:

To the Minister of Property Management: To date, how much has been spent on the construction project of the Finance headquarters on College Avenue in Regina?

Answer:

\$11,720,581.28 was certified for payment.

Mr. Hart asked the Government the following Question No. 67, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Nilson:

To the Minister of Environment: (1) Is the provincial government aware of the study released on November 13, 2006 by the World Wildlife Federation Canada raising concerns about the impact of Alberta oil sands development on Saskatchewan's water supply? (2) If so, what action has the government taken to address the concerns raised about the sustainability of the water supply that flows to Saskatchewan through the Mackenzie River System?

Answer:

(1) Yes.

(2) In 1997, the Province signed the Mackenzie River Basin Transboundary Waters Master Agreement between the Governments of Canada, British Columbia, Alberta, Northwest Territories and Yukon to ensure the use of the water in the basin is sustainable in all jurisdictions. The Province is a member of the Mackenzie River Basin Board, which administers the Master Agreement.

Mr. Hart asked the Government the following Question No. 68, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Nilson:

To the Minister of Environment: (1) Has the provincial government raised the issue of ensuring a sustainable supply of water for Saskatchewan with the Government of Alberta? (2) If so, what actions have been taken by the provincial government to ensure that Saskatchewan has access to a sustainable downstream of water supply from water sources flowing into Saskatchewan from Alberta?

Answer:

(1) Yes.

(2) The province is a member of the Prairie Provinces Water Board and Mackenzie River Basin Board, and through these Boards the province ensures quantity and quality objectives are fulfilled by Alberta.

Mr. Hart asked the Government the following Question No. 69, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Nilson:

To the Minister of Environment: Have the Government of Saskatchewan taken action to negotiate a binding water agreement to regulate trans-boundary usage of water from the Mackenzie River basin?

Answer:

Saskatchewan has discussed with Alberta the principles of a transboundary water management agreement and expect to initiate formal negotiations with Alberta within the next year.

Mr. Hart asked the Government the following Question No. 70, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Nilson:

To the Minister of Environment: Given the importance of a sustainable oil sands development for Saskatchewan and a sustainable water supply to develop our oil sands, what action is the provincial government taking to ensure the Saskatchewan's oil sands are served by a sustainable water supply?

Answer:

The Government of Saskatchewan's thorough regulatory framework, the ongoing monitoring and assessment of Saskatchewan's water resources, and the recently announced water conservation plan ensure that projects, such as oil sands, are developed with the principle of sustainability.
