- (e) The government's decision to provide Murdoch Carriere with a \$275,000 out-of-court settlement and a full pension, and;

That once the said committee is satisfied it has verified the facts of the matter, it make recommendations in its report as follows:

- (a) The steps that should be taken to learn from and act on mistakes made;
- (b) What should be done to ensure, to the greatest extent possible, a safe and harassment-free workplace for all employees;
- (c) What should be done to ensure that when harassment allegations are made, they are dealt with appropriately, and further;

That pursuant to Rule 146(5) the Committee be instructed to initiate its enquiry immediately.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Mr. Elhard asked the Government the following Question No. 1042, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Atkinson:

To the Minister of Advanced Education and Employment: What is the total amount that has been allocated to the Academic Health Sciences Centre at the University of Saskatchewan?

Answer:

To date, \$101.3M has been provided to the University of Saskatchewan for the Academic Health Sciences Centre.

Mr. Elhard asked the Government the following Question No. 1043, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Atkinson:

To the Minister of Advanced Education and Employment: What is the expected completion date of the Academic Health Sciences Centre at the University of Saskatchewan?

Answer:

The renovations to the existing structures will be completed by 2013. This includes new construction as well as renovations to existing structures. There are two phases to the project: the biomedical wing is scheduled to be completed by spring 2011. The second phase, including renovations to the existing structures, is scheduled to be completed by spring 2011.

Mr. Morgan asked the Government the following Question No. 1044, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Quennell:

To the Minister of Justice: (1) Has the investigation by the Saskatchewan Judicial Council into provincial court judge Terrence Bekolay been completed? (2) If so, what were the results of that investigation?

Answer:

- (1) The Saskatchewan Judicial Council is an independent body that has the responsibility to investigate the conduct of a judge when it receives a complaint respecting the judge. We have not been notified that the investigation has been completed.
- (2) N/A

Mr. Morgan asked the Government the following Question No. 1045, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Quennell:

To the Minister of Justice: What was the reason behind the suspension of provincial court judge Terrence Bekolay in November 2006?

Answer:

The Saskatchewan Judicial Council is an independent body that has the responsibility to investigate the conduct of a judge when it receives a complaint respecting the judge. The Judicial Council publicly announced that it suspended Judge Bekolay on October 12, 2006, with pay, pending the investigation of a complaint. Since the matter is currently under investigation by the Judicial Council, it would not be appropriate for me to comment further.

Mr. Morgan asked the Government the following Question No. 1046, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Quennell:

To the Minister of Justice: (1) Is provincial court judge Terrence Bekolay still under suspension? (2) If so, is he still being paid?

Answer:

- (1) We understand from the Saskatchewan Judicial Council that Judge Bekolay is currently under suspension.
- (2) Yes. The Saskatchewan Judicial Council publicly announced that it suspended Judge Bekolay with pay, pending the investigation of a complaint.

Ms. Harpauer asked the Government the following Question No. 1047, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Thomson:

To the Minister Responsible for SaskEnergy Incorporated: (1) Does SaskEnergy outsource any of its operations to out-of-province companies? (2) If so, what services, what companies are providing services, in which province, at what cost, and how long has SaskEnergy been doing this?

Answer:

- (1) Yes, however the core distribution, transmission and storage operation of SaskEnergy is managed by its employees within Saskatchewan. Whenever possible, SaskEnergy endeavors to source competitively-priced goods and services from within Saskatchewan. The business objective of SaskEnergy is that 75% of goods and services be sourced in Saskatchewan.
 - As part of the operations of SaskEnergy, some goods and services, such as compressor equipment, are purchased from out-of-province vendors because some specialized purchases are not available from Saskatchewan vendors.
- (2) N/A

Ms. Harpauer asked the Government the following Question No. 1048, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Nilson:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Power Corporation: (1) Does SaskPower outsource any of its operations to out-of-province companies? (2) If so, what services, what companies are providing services, in which province, at what cost, and how long has SaskPower been doing this?

Answer:

- (1) Yes, however the core distribution and transmission operations of SaskPower are managed by its employees within Saskatchewan. Whenever possible, SaskPower endeavors to source competitively priced goods and services from within Saskatchewan. In 2006, SaskPower purchased 84% of its goods and services from companies in Saskatchewan. All purchases of \$5000 and over are conducted and governed under SaskPower's Procurement to Payment Policy and Procedures.
 - SaskPower's competitive purchasing processes provide a fair, open, transparent and competitive environment that builds and maintains good community, public and vendor/supplier relationships while ensuring the highest business ethic standards.
- (2) N/A

Ms. Harpauer asked the Government the following Question No. 1049, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Higgins:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Telecommunications Corporation: (1) Does SaskTel have any offices in Alberta? (2) If so, how many people are employed there, what functions does the office perform, and what is the cost to operate the office?

Answer:

- (1) Although there are no SaskTel offices, there are three DirectWest offices in Alberta.
- (2) There are 33 people employed in the Alberta offices. The primary function is sales, in the competitive directory business, as well as sales support positions. The production and billing/collections occurs in Regina. The cost to operate the offices is \$20,000/month.

Mr. McMorris asked the Government the following Question No. 1050, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Taylor:

To the Minister of Health: How much money was paid out in severance, and to whom, during the fiscal year 2006/07?

At the end of February 2007, there were a total of 6,891* patients waiting for a Bone Mineral Density test.

*This figure includes patients who are waiting for follow-up testing at a future date as determined by their physicians. They are not waiting because of lack of capacity to provide the test. The exact number of these patients is not available, as health regions do not keep separate records for these patients at this time.

Mr. McMorris asked the Government the following Question No. 1053, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Taylor:

To the Minister of Health: What was the total amount of money spent on Ministerial travel in the fiscal year 2006/07?

Answer:
