To the Minister of Health: How much money was paid out in severance, and to whom, in the fiscal year 2006/07?

Answer:

The Department of Health has kept statistics on the number of health care workers who have received a recruitment grant, to date. As a result this number does not account for all health workforce employees or professionals who have been recruited since the fall of 2006.

Mr. McMorris asked the Government the following Question No. 1316, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Taylor:

To the Minister of Health: (1) Which regional health authorities have engaged Deloitte Inc. to complete operational and service delivery reviews? (2) What are the timelines for completion? (3) Will the results be made public?
