Answer:

There is no source for estimates of actual quarterly Saskatchewan GDP. Statistics Canada does not produce estimates of actual quarterly GDP at the sub-national level. Neither does the Saskatchewan Bureau of Statistics. The Ministry of Finance updates its forecast of annual GDP twice each year, at budget and at mid-year.
