Capital investment may include anything from buildings, network (access, transport), towers, software, gateways, and does include the salaries for capital projects.

The new structure of the Ministry of Social Services will be comprised of four divisions:

- Child and Family Services This division will focus on developing, designing and implementing
 effective child welfare programs and services delivered by the ministry or its community
 partners. The new management structure in the division is being designed to support front line
 service delivery.
- Corporate Services This new division will develop, implement and evaluate frameworks that align and integrate the policy, planning, corporate systems and performance management of the ministry's three program divisions. Centralizing and coordinating corporate services functions in this division will reduce overlap and duplication and allow program divisions to focus on client service delivery. This division will also house a strengthened central policy unit to allow for insight into common clients across programs through co-ordinated research, policy and evaluation.
- Housing This division is being restructured to achieve greater alignment with the ministry through strategic policy, program delivery, and operating practices to serve the ministry's clients and the public at large.
- Income Assistance and Disability Services This new division aligns the Office of Disability Issues and the former Community Living and Income Assistance divisions in a new structure that will integrate program and service design for people with disabilities. It will also develop, design and implement income benefit programs and services.
