QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Ms. Higgins asked the Government the following Question No. 412, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Cheveldayoff:

To the Minister Responsible for the Saskatchewan Gaming Corporation: What information is obtained from the Saskatchewan Gaming Corporation (SGC) Players' Club cards each time they are used?

Answer:

Every time a Players Club card is used, information is collected on the date of play, duration of play and amount wagered. In the case of table games, the amount wagered is estimated by the Pit Boss. Players Club cards also track the redemption of any coupons and/or Players Club points. Occasionally players have the opportunity to swipe their cards to enter special contests.

Ms. Higgins asked the Government the following Question No. 413, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Cheveldayoff:

To the Minister Responsible for the Saskatchewan Gaming Corporation: For what purpose is the information from the Saskatchewan Gaming Corporation (SGC) Players' Club cards obtained?

Answer:

The information collected on the Players Club card is used SGC for market research to: provide members with points that can be redeemed for rewards; establish player segments to better analyze customer behaviour and demographics; distribute segmented marketing offers; monitor and analyze redemption rates of coupons and Players Club points; and administer contests. The information gathered allows Sask Gaming to provide a customer statement showing a record of play history to those members who have requested it. The information is also used to monitor gaming behaviour and flag guests that are considered to be at a high risk for problem gambling according to pre-determined criteria. This allows Responsible Gaming Specialists to initiate timely interactions with the guest and provide them with information and resources so they can make responsible choices about their play.

The terms and conditions of the Players Club program are provided to guests on the application form. By signing the application form, the applicants agree to the terms and conditions of the Players Club program.

Ms. Higgins asked the Government the following Question No. 414, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Cheveldayoff:

Answer:

The information obtained from the Players Club card is archived in a database for analysis and used for the purposes stated in the answer to Written Question No. 413.

Answer:

- (1) Information is provided to our agencies of record for direct mail and SGC directed market research. As agencies of record, these organizations are bound by confidentiality policies and procedures as required by SGC in recognition of *The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.
- (2) In the case of direct mail: name, address, and postal code. In the case of market research, phone number only.
- (3) SGC's agency of record for direct mail is Arcas Direct Marketing Group and SGC's agency of record for market research is Fast Consulting.
- (4) Direct mail consists of a monthly Players Club newsletter and Players Club offers. Market research consists of telephone surveys and focus groups.

- (2) SGC's agency of record for market research is Fast Consulting.
