There will be no priority pool system or limited quotas for 2011." Will licenses available in specific zones to Saskatchewan residents be reduced by the number applied for by Canadian residents? (2) Are Canadian resident licenses over and above the quotas available to Saskatchewan resident applicable to Canadian resident licenses, but reduced quotas available to Saskatchewan residents in the big game draws for 2011?
