Answer:

A grant of \$700,000 was provided from the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure in 2009-10.

Mr. Wotherspoon asked the government the following Question No. 184, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Boyd:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Power Corporation: (1) What were SaskPower's expenses to set up and operate the Global Transportation Hub in 2008? (2) 2009? (3) 2010? (4) 2011? (5) 2012?

Answer:

SaskPower's capital investments to connect the Global Transportation Hub were as follows:

- (2) In fiscal year 2008-09 was \$197,189.
- (3) In fiscal year 2009-10 was \$6,670,375.

Mr. Wotherspoon asked the government the following Question No. 193, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. McMorris:

To the Minister of Highways and Infrastructure: (1) What were the expenses for rezoning and land development for the Global Transportation Hub, as a special operating agency, in 2007? (2) 2008? (3) 2009?

Answer:

- (1) The Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure's expenses for rezoning and land development for the Global Transportation Hub in fiscal year 2007-08, was \$324,275.
- (2) In fiscal year 2008-09 was \$1,516,732.
- (3) In fiscal year 2009-10 was \$11,669,709.

Mr. Wotherspoon asked the government the following Question No. 194, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. McMorris:

A grant of \$700,000 was provided from the Ministry of Highways & Infrastructure in 2009-10.

Mr. Wotherspoon asked the government the following Question No. 196, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Krawetz:

To the Minister of Finance: What were the Ministry of Finance's expenses and roles to set up the Global Transportation Hub?

Answer:

The Global Transportation Hub was established by Order in Council (OC) 492/2009 in June of 2009. The OC appointed the Minister of Finance as an agent of the corporation for the purposes of making investments pursuant to subsection 45(1) of *The Crown Corporations Act*, 1993, or disposing of those investments. The Ministry of Finance reviewed the Global Transportation Hub's business plan and borrowing limits. The Ministry of Finance did not incur any additional expense as a result of these activities.

Mr. Wotherspoon asked the government the following Question No. 197, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. McMorris:

To the Minister of Highways and Infrastructure: (1) What were the Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure's expenses to operate the Global Transportation Hub in 2009? (2) 2010? (3) 2011? (4) 2012? (5) What are the expenses projected to be on an ongoing basis?

Answer:

- (1) The Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure's expenses to operate the Global Transportation Hub in fiscal year 2009-10 was \$700,000.
- (2) In fiscal year 2010-11 was zero.
- (3) In fiscal year 2011-12 was zero.
- (4) In fiscal year 2012-13 is zero.
- (5) The Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure does not anticipate there being any further expenses related to the operation of the Global Transportation Hub.

Ms. Sproule asked the government the following Question No. 200, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Cheveldayoff:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Water Security Agency: What is the Saskatchewan Water Security Agency's recommended total solution mining operations for the province?

Answer:

The Water Security Agency does not have a recommended total for solution mining in the province. The Water Security Agency evaluates water availability for a new allocation on a project by project basis considering existing uses and available supply.

Ms. Sproule asked the government the following Question No. 201, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Cheveldayoff:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Water Security Agency: (1) Has there been any acidification of Saskatchewan groundwater due to solution mining practices at Belle Plaine or Patience Lake? (2) If so, in what year(s)?

Answer:

There has not been any reported acidification to groundwater in the mining operations.

Ms. Sproule asked the government the following Question No. 202, which was answered by the Hon. Mr. Cheveldayoff:

To the Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Water Security Agency: (1) Have there been any spills of leachates upon the surface from the province's mines in 2007 (2) 2008? (3) 2009? (4) 2010? (5) 2011? (6) 2012?

Answer:

Yes. Spills or discharges of mine tailings or leachate from mine tailings do occur on occasion and have occurred in these years. All spills are required to be reported to the Ministry of Environment when they occur and the company is required to undertake actions to correct the problem and remediate the impacts. Currently all spill incidents are listed on the SaskSpills website at www.saskspills.ca.

Ms. Chartier asked the government the following Question No. 203, which was answered by the Hon. Ms. Draude:

To the Minister of Social Services: (1) How much money has been budgeted to support the transition of residents from Valley View into the community? (2) What expenditures is this meant to cover? (3) Over what period of time is this budgeted?

Answer:

- (1) To date, the ministry has allocated \$1.05M in 2012-13 to support the Valley View Centre transition.
- (2) The funds support project management and planning for the transition of residents from Valley View Centre. No residents have been, or are expected to be, transitioned during the current fiscal year.
- (3) 2012-13 fiscal year.
